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The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following **OBJECTIVE:**

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

Year 3 children will have one lesson per week for 10 weeks. However, we intend to use our Sports Premium grant to provide extra 10 weeks of lessons for the pupils that have not achieved 25m. We will offer year 4 lessons as they did not finish their course of 10 lessons in year 3 due to Lockdown. We will offer catch up swimming lessons to year 5 children who did not achieve the expected standard. We work with the local Leisure Centre to encourage the children to continue with swimming lessons where possible, and to encourage them to attend recreational swimming through vouchers and incentives.
