A happy new year and welcome to the Spring 1 newsletter which gives a brief outline of what your child will be learning and enjoying for the next half term. If you have any questions or queries, please come and see us at the MUGA at home time or you can email or call the school office.

Maths:

In maths we will be learning how to multiply and divide by 2 digit numbers and looking for relationships between multiplication and division. We will then move onto measurement and will be learning about length and mass. We will be using maths equipment and pictorial representations to help us find solutions to maths problems.

Literacy

We will start the term by looking at the book, 'The Incredible Book Eating Boy.' We will be using this to support our writing skills such as: punctuation, speech and complex sentences. Later in the term we will look at the poem, 'I asked the boy who cannot see' and use this to structure our writing.

We will continue with daily spelling lessons and work on vocabulary and reading comprehension in guided reading. Please listen to your child read as much as possible at home, questioning them on their understanding too as this is a very important skill.

R.E:

We will be learning about the faith founders and what they taught. We will learn about the teaching and life of Jesus and how he inspires Christians.

Art, Design and Technology:

We will be looking at electronic world and learning how to programme a micro bit. Then creating an electronic charm pouch to hold our micro bit in.

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Computing: We will be learning how to touch type and will revisit e-safety and how to stay safe online. We hope you will be able to join us in our e-safety lesson later in the term.

<u>Reading</u>

Your child's progress in reading is the most important aspect of their learning at school. Please support us by listening to them read as often as possible at home.

Being a good reader has many benefits and we encourage all our pupils to read for enjoyment as well as for learning and in order to access the full curriculum.
