#### Maths:

In Maths, we will be learning different methods of addition and subtraction using our Maths Scheme, 'Maths No Problem'. The children will continue to use maths equipment and pictorial representations to help them to develop their skills and to find different methods of finding solutions. We will move on to multiplication and division towards the end of the half term.

## Literacy

Our literacy work this term will be based on the narrative non-fiction 'The Street Beneath my Feet' by Charlotte Guillian. We will be looking at the different elements of non-fiction and then writing our own.

Later in the term we will be looking at the story 'The Secret of Black Rock' by Joe Todd Stanton. We will be using this to support our writing skills such as; speech marks, capital letters, questions and exclamation marks.

## R.E:

We will continue our theme of 'Remembering' and will learn about 'Remembrance Sunday' and the significance of the poppy. We will also be learning about the Christingle celebration, and will look at the significance of Mary to the Christmas Story.

## Design and Technology

We will explore drawing and sketching through the theme of 'Growing and Artists'. In this unit children will be encouraged to use simple shapes to create a variety of images.
