#### Music

Music will be taught on Wednesday afternoons and, this half term, they will be learning all about discomusic.



# <u>Jigsaw</u>

Our Jigsaw topic this half term is Dreams and Goals, where we will be learning about how to structure our own goals and how these can help us to aim for and achieve our dreams.

## Religious Education

Our topic this term is 'Living a Faith,' in which children will study ways that people identify themselves through various religious and non-religious perspectives and how these relate to each other

## Topic (History)

Our topic this half term is the Ancient Mayans. We will be learning all about this civilisation and what the world has learnt from them. We will be linking this with our computing unit, in which the children will imagine visiting a Mayan temple.

## Science

We will be learning about Light. Children will participate in experiments to learn about this topic and understand how we are able to see the world around us.

## English

Writing: This half term, we will write a narrative linked to a picture book called 'The Promise' before moving onto a thrilling story called 'Malamander.'

Reading: We are continuing to read Risks and Thrills, a book which includes a selection of fiction, non-fiction and poetry.

## <u>Art</u>

Our unit this half term is called Making My Voice Heard, in which the children will learn about how artists express their personalities using art.

Children are expected to read at home everyday for 15 minutes and they may also access Reading Plus as part of this. Reading is a crucial part of the children's learning and readiness for secondary school. They are expected to read at least 110 words per minute during their SATs tests, so we need to ensure that they are prepared to read at this speed through regular practice.
